# NARFE CHAPTER 1192 EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING MINUTES May 7, 2019

President Lorie Bennett called the meeting to order at 1:03 p.m., Zintel Creek Golf Club, Kennewick, Wash., and then led the Pledge of Allegiance. # President: Lorie Bennett

- Board position descriptions Mary recapped the discussion at the April board meeting. She said she still needs some input from several board members.
- Speaker requests -
  - United Way Pat reported that she received an email from Brian Stickney, a United Way board member (and DOE employee). He saw Pat's name on the chapter's website and noted there were chapter meeting program vacancies for both September and October. He offered to have Dr. LoAnn Ayers, local United Way president, speak at one of the meetings about what nonprofits are doing in our community. The board concurred having her for October but requested that Pat emphasize that the focus be on what nonprofits are doing in our community vs. soliciting for United Way donations. Pat will follow up.
  - Blue Cross/Blue Shield Johanna reported that she received an email from Mary Lynn Schmid, account executive, BCBS Federal Employee Program, offering to speak at a chapter meeting about BCBS and some of its specific programs. The board discussed the offer and concluded it does not fit within established program practices, that is, having speakers who would be focusing on basically soliciting for the business/service they represent. Johanna will close the loop with Mary Lynn.
- Chapter Bylaws NARFE has released new bylaws guidance and a suggested template. Mary is reviewing the chapter's bylaws for compliance.
- Lorie said she will not be at the June meeting; 1<sup>st</sup> VP Pat will conduct the meeting.

- Service Officer John had no report.
- Service Office Nancy said she still has not been able to get the voice message system to
  work on the phone. Also, there has been no word on vacating the office. There was a brief
  discussion about some of the material/items in the office. Johanna asked about the
  overhead projector. She said she thought it was something purchased when Carl Gallion
  was active in the chapter. With current technology it is not being used.

- Liz suggested reducing the signatures on the Gesa account to only 2 vs. 4. Also, she expressed concern regarding protecting the chapter's account when it is also used for other purposes, e.g., for depositing funds from the regional training conference.

## Public Relations/Newsletter: Mary Binder

- June/July/August newsletter -
  - Articles are due to Mary by Friday, May 10.
  - Resending returned newsletters Mary said Johanna had asked that the board discuss resending returned newsletters. When she was the editor, she said she did not resend them, just noted changes of address for the next issue. Mary said she has opted to resend them when she can to help keep members informed. Typically, between 3 and 5 are returned each issue. The board concurred with Mary's suggestion to let the editor make the decision on resending newsletters.
- Senior Pages ad bill update Mary reported she received a text message April 22 from the
  publication's publisher, Robert Kannberg. The ad/our account has been on auto renewal, so
  Mary was not contacted regarding continuing the ad and/or approving the contents. Per Mr.
  Kannberg's text, they would write off the \$300 cost and we would not receive any further
  bills. Mary reconfirmed this information in a reply text to Mr. Kannberg on April 25.
- June 13, Senior Life Show, Three Rivers Convention Center Mary reported that she has submitted the registration application and has received an acknowledgement. She needs volunteers to help staff the chapter's NARFE table.

- WSF President Nancy:
  - Nancy said she will be having hip replacement surgery June 10.
  - Region IX Training Conference, May 17-18, Three Rivers Convention Center. Nancy provided a general update. Currently, about 70 members from across the region are registered. She is doing follow ups with vendors.
