# NARFE Chapter 1192 November 6, 2019 Chapter Meeting Minutes

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u> President Lorie Bennett called the meeting to order at 12:04 p.m., Red Lion Hotel, Kennewick, Wash. She reminded attendees to silence their electronic devices.

- Lorie called for a moment of silence for all who are struggling to find food and shelter; for our military and civilians defending us and our country; and for our NARFE leaders and members. She then led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- Lorie welcomed 18 members and 1 quest, member Bill Darke's wife, Marilyn.

## OFFICER/FEDERATION/DISTRICT/COMMITTEE REPORTS

President President Lorie.

- Lorie again welcomed members and guests. She reminded members to take care of their vehicles, considering the area already had a touch of winter in October.
- The election of officers for 2020/2022 will be conducted under new business.
- 2020 lunch menu copies of the proposed new menu were provided to each member.
   Nancy Crosby and Darleen Wall have been working this initiative with the Red Lion. Nancy could not attend the meeting, so Mary Binder summarized for members that:
  - There were 3 new entrees proposed for March, April and September; there would be a bread change to the sandwich at the May meeting; and, the menus for the November and December meetings would be reversed.
  - o The cost for the meal with salad, dessert and tax/gratuity would be \$19.71; without the salad, \$19.05.

Treasurer's Report Liz Bowers.

- Liz reported that the chapter's savings and checking accounts combined balance at the beginning of October was \$16,097.54. October income, \$764.60; expenses, \$414.06. Ending balance, \$16,448.08.
- Monies collected at the November Meeting Luncheon, \$306; Alzheimer's Research Fund, \$2,525; NARFE-PAC, \$6; newsletter, \$23; 50/50, \$22 collected/\$11 awarded, and donated to the NARFE Alzheimer's Research Fund; general donations, \$0.

#### Secretary/Sunshine Mary Binder for Secretary Faye Vlieger.

- Mary Binder was taking the meeting minutes today for Secretary Faye who was ill.
- Several "Sunshine" updates since the November/December chapter newsletter members John Harris, Bill Hoyt and Bob Stewart are ill. Secretary Faye will be sending them cards.

#### Newsletter/Public Relations Mary Binder.

- November/December chapter newsletter is finalized and distributed.
  - o All members indicated they had received theirs.
  - Mary reminded members about the new "hidden numbers" in the newsletter the last 4 numbers of their NARFE membership number.
  - Mary also reminded members who may be receiving a mailed copy to consider receiving an electronic copy as it saves the chapter postage.
- Senior Times Expo, Tuesday, October 15, Southridge Sports & Events Complex Mary asked if anyone had attended. No one indicated they had. Mary said she did attend, primarily to gather information and talk with one of the organizers. While table space is more expensive than the Senior Life Show at the Three Rivers Convention Center and there is not a nonprofit rate, Mary said she discussed with the executive board possibly participating next year on a trial basis and will add this to the chapter's 2020 outreach action plan.
- November 12, Visit Tri-Cities Annual Meeting, Three Rivers Convention Center Mary said she, Nancy Crosby and Pat Turner are planning to attend. If the chapter has at least 8 reservations, we can have a designated table versus open seating. The meeting's program is "Mission: Not So Impossible" and will celebrate Visit Tri-Cities' 50th anniversary. Members can contact Mary if they want to attend.
- November 20, monthly luncheon/meeting, Tri-City Regional Chamber of Commerce, Red Lion, Pasco. Scheduled guest speaker is Vicky Sharlau, executive director, Columbia Basin Development League. Her presentation will be an overview and update on the Columbia Basin Project: Irrigation isn't just for Farmers. Mary, Nancy and Pat are planning to attend. Again, the chapter can have a reserved table with 8 or more reservations. Members can let Mary know if they want to attend.
- The annual NARFE photo contest is August 1 through April 7, 2020. This year's theme –
   "Home Sweet Home." NARFE wants to know what that means to you. Handouts with
   information were available.
- Combined Federal Campaign, September 9 through January 12. Handouts were available. **Legislative** *Mary Binder.*
- Federal many retirees will receive "a modest 1.6% COLA" in 2020. "The increase amounts to \$24 a month for the average retired worker," according to the Social Security Administration.
- State Mary and Randy Grekowicz highlighted their experiences at the Washington Policy Center's annual Eastern Washington dinner/fundraiser, Thursday, October 24, The Davenport Grand Hotel, Spokane. More than 1,000 people attended the event, including Randy's wife, Fia. Keynote speakers were Chris Christie, former NJ governor, and General

James Mattis, former Secretary of Defense. Mary shared that besides meeting both keynote speakers, she also had a chance to talk briefly with Congressman Dan Newhouse who had introduced General Mattis. Both Mary and Randy shared that it was a memorable evening.

**NARFE-PAC** Mary Binder for Bob Stewart. Bob was not able to attend the meeting.

- Mary reminded members that while today was the chapter's annual fundraiser for the NARFE Alzheimer's Research Fund, NARFE-PAC contributions are also important, and will become even more so during the coming year as the 2020 election gets closer.
- Mary reminded members that the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter PAC reports for the period ending September 30 were now on the NARFE website, www.narfe.org. Highlights are in the current chapter newsletter. To note, in particular, the chapter ranked 7<sup>th</sup> in the state for contributions but second in the number of sustainers. Of the 10 NARFE regions, Region IX (Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington) remained at the top in mean contributions. It also ranked 5<sup>th</sup> in sustainers and 9<sup>th</sup> in overall contributions. In looking at Washington State, we ranked 6<sup>th</sup> of all 50 states and territories in the total amount contributed and 9<sup>th</sup> in the number of contributors. Considering the state is not one of the largest, this is notable. Also, Washington's Congressman Derek Kilmer (D-06) was one of just 6 congressmen/senators who has received \$6K or more in NARFE-PAC distributions in this 2-year congressional cycle, which reflects his strong support to NARFE. The maximum is \$10K during the cycle.

  - The 2020 WSF conference is scheduled for May 19-21, Embassy Suites by Hilton, Seattle North, Lynnwood.
    - There will be an election for officers prior to the conference. Election information is scheduled to be posted on the federation website, <a href="www.narfe.org">www.narfe.org</a>, by November 15. President Nancy will be sending an email to those federation members with an email address in the NARFE database.
    - The federation will provide a \$50 "scholarship" for federation members who attend to help offset costs.
